### **Pivotal Point**

## The influence of the preacher is <u>still</u> strong and it flows:

- 1. Outside the boundaries of the pulpit and
- 2. Onto the cultural concerns of the people in the pews...

- COVID-19/Coronavirus Pandemic.


Although all of these events are worthwhile research subjects, sermonic responses to the 9/11 tragedy is a good place to start for multiple reasons.


